SNOW LEOPARD KARAKORAM HIGHWAY AND INDUS RIVER, PAKISTAN

Rare and elusive, this big cat has evolved to survive in its remote, steep, rugged Himalayan habitat. It has a powerful body and can leap six times the length of its body. Wide, fur-covered feet help Snow Leopards walk on deep snow and a thick grey-white rosetted coat provides excellent camouflage. Thier habitat range covers the mountainous regions of 12 countries across Asia, but this is becoming increasingly fragmented due to human settlement and grazing space. Hunting for the illegal fur trade and in retaliation for killing livestock has made them endangered.

HAWKSBILL TURTLE

Hawksbill Turtles feed mainly on sponges, extracting them from crevices on the reef using their narrow, pointed beaks. This helps maintain the health of reefs, giving better access for fish to feed. The female lays a clutch of about 140 eggs in a hole in the sand. Found in tropical oceans, mostly in coral reefs, they are critically endangered due to illegal trade in their shells. Their beautifully marbled shell makes them a valuable target for the decorative 'tortoiseshell' market. Entanglement in fishing nets and hooks is another threat.

KOALA EUCALYPT FOREST, SOUTHEAST AUSTRALIA


These endearing furry marsupials have adapted to life in the trees, with a curved spine so they can sit and sleep in the crooks of branches, and strong teeth to bite and chew eucalyptus leaves, their staple diet.

The joey grows in the mother's pouch for six months. Historically, Koalas were heavily hunted for their fur, leading to a big population decline in the 1900s. Although no longer hunted, they now face increasing threats such as deforestation for agricultural and urban developments, deadly disease, traffic strikes, and dog attacks.

AFRICAN PENGUIN BOULDERS BEACH, CAPE PENINSULA SOUTH AFRICA

This is the only penguin species on the African continent, with a robust body with black and white markings unique to each bird. Also called the Jackass Penguin due to its braying call, it can stay underwater for two and a half minutes and dive to a depth of 60m for fish. Its rapid decline is caused by environmental changes in the Indian Ocean, and threats such as overfishing, oil spillages, collection of eggs and of the guano that protects its burrows. Populations have diminished drastically and it is threatened with extinction if steps are not taken to conserve it.

ROLOWAY MONKEY

BOTI FALLS, BOTI FOREST RESERVE, GHANA

Roloway Monkeys have unique colour patterns that help them recognise each other. Males are bigger, with long white beards to make them more attractive to mates. They communicate the location of food when foraging through the rainforest by chuckles, croaks and yells. However, this can also make it easier for poachers to find them. They are critically endangered as they cannot adapt to increasing deforestation – the felling of hardwood trees, and the cultivation of cocoa and palm oil. Hunting for the bushmeat and fur industries are other threats.



SUMATRAN ELEPHANTBUKIT LAWANG, SUMATRA, INDONESIA

Sumatran Elephants are smaller than African Elephants and not all have tusks. They feed on a variety of plants and deposit seeds wherever they go, contributing to a healthy forest ecosystem. These elephants have a critically endangered status – they face habitat loss through a high rate of deforestation due to paper and pulp industries, and palm oil plantations. Although the hunting of elephants was banned in Indonesia in 1931, and with them protected under Indonesian law, poaching nonetheless remains a considerable conservation threat.

WHOOPING CRANE
ARANSAS WILDLIFE REFUGE, TEXAS, USA
The tallest bird in North America, with a red crown and a long, dark,
pointed bill, is named after its whooping call, especially during
courtship. It prefers wetland habitats with many aquatic plants, nesting
on the ground in a raised area on a marsh, laying 1–2 eggs. Whooping
Cranes are endangered because of habitat loss due to wetland drainage.

Lack of food is also a problem as they feed on crustaceans such as the

blue crab, which are depleted by the effects of climate change. They also face threats during migration due to collisions with power lines.

RED PANDA ANNAPURNA CONSERVATION AREA MANANG DISTRICT, NEPAL

Quite small, with thick russet fur, Red Pandas stay mostly in the trees, using their long, bushy tails for balance and to cover themselves in the cold of their Eastern Himalayas habitat. Agile climbers, they feed mostly on bamboo shoots and leaves, and forage for roots, fruits and insects. Due to forest clearance, their nesting trees and bamboo food source are being lost, and populations have declined. They are endangered as they occupy a very narrow temperature range in their habitat. As temperatures rise, they need to move to higher elevations to adapt.


IBERIAN LYNX NATURE PARK LOS ALCORNOCALES ALGECIRAS, SPAIN

The Iberian Lynx, with a tawny spotted coat and 'bearded' face, and prominent ear tufts, long legs and a short, black-tipped tail, is native to the Iberian Peninsula, where it preys exclusively on rabbits. It is the world's most endangered feline due to fragmented populations, a diminishing food base, and habitat loss caused by road building and vehicle strikes. Hunting and trapping in the past, for its valuable fur and meat, put it on the verge of extinction; however, since 2002, it has been reintroduced. It now has legal protection, so numbers are increasing.

BLACK RHINOCEROSKGALAGADI TRANSFRONTIER PARK, BOTSWANA

Not black but grey or brown, with two horns, these generally solitary pachyderms inhabit grassland and forests, never far from a water source in which to cool themselves down by wallowing in mud or water. Classed as critically endangered, their numbers fell drastically between 1970 and 1992, when poaching and hunting killed off 96% of Africa's Black Rhino. Their two horns make them a lucrative target for poachers because of the demand for rhino horn, a prized ingredient in traditional Chinese medicine, and hundreds are still illegally slaughtered each year.

COZUMEL RACCOON COZUMEL ISLAND, MEXICO

The Cozumel Raccoon – also called the Pygmy or Dwarf Raccoon – is a critically endangered species native only to Cozumel Island, on the Yucatan Peninsula. These small raccoons are nocturnal and generally solitary. Their hind feet can rotate up to 180°, which enables them to climb trees easily. They mostly inhabit mangrove forests and sandy coastal wetlands in the north-west tip of the island. This restricted range and a small population is a threat to their survival. The development of Cozumel Island, due to the tourism industry, has led to habitat loss.



WESTERN LOWLAND GORILLABAI HOKOU, DZANGA SANGHA RESERVE, CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC

Western Lowland Gorillas are slightly smaller than other gorilla subspecies, with wider skulls, more pronounced brow ridges and smaller ears. The exact number is not known because they inhabit some of the most dense and remote rainforests in Africa. Significant populations still exist, including in isolated swamps and the remote swampy forests of the Congo Basin. However, because of poaching and disease, numbers have declined by more than 60% over the last 20–25 years. Gorillas are the largest living primates, 95–99% genetically identical to humans.
